TSV and NWQ region comprises the 15 local government areas of Boulia (S), Burdekin (S), Burke (S), Carpentaria (S), Charters Towers (R), Cloncurry (S), Doomadgee (S), Flinders (S), Hinchinbrook (S), McKinlay (S), Mornington (S), Mount Isa (C), Palm Island (S), Richmond (S) and Townsville (C). The region name TSV and NWQ region is the customisable region name provided by the generator of this report and does not necessarily represent the current view of Queensland Treasury or the Queensland Government.

### Estimated resident population

As at 30 June 2020, the estimated resident population (ERP) for TSV and NWQ region was 269,048 persons. The annual growth rate between 2019r and 2020p was 0.6 per cent.
